Thumbnail Biosketch

Born in 1950 in Chatham, ON, Greg joined the Essex and Kent Scottish (E&K Scot) at age 15 as an infantry soldier rising to the rank of MWO. Educated in Chatham and at Seneca College, he later earned a Bachelor of Science (Geology) from U of Windsor. He continued serving in the rank of Lieutenant with The Regular Force First Battalion The Royal Canadian Regiment, later transferring back to E&K Scot where he served in most senior appointments for a total of 44 years until compulsory retirement at age 60 in 2010.

Since 2010 Greg continues to serve in a voluntary appointment as the Regimental Major of E&K Scot. From 1978 to the present, Greg has served on the Board of Directors (BoD) of the E&K Scot Association and currently serves as a Director on the Scottish Borderers Foundation.

In civilian life, Detective Childs served for over 34 years with London Police Service as a Forensic Homicide Detective and concurrently as a Sergeant on the Bomb Disposal Squad, retiring in 2008. Greg has been married to his high school sweetheart Carol since 1975 and they have two children Jennifer and Andrew.

Greg has been assigned as historian of London & Western Ontario Branch of UELAC for 10 years, assisting his wife Carol who has been branch president for 8 years. Service has also been rendered as Parliamentarian of Dominion Council, UELAC.

Greg currently also volunteers as chair of the Woodland Cemetery BoD, and as a warden at St. Paul's Cathedral in London, where he also performs military research on past parishioners.
